Road Signs

You may have noticed quite a few of the township road signs have disappeared and you've been scratching your head asking "why". A federal study was conducted and it was deemed that many road signs were unnecessary and even a hazard. The study concluded that uncontrolled intersections were safer than those that had a stop or yield sign. Watch for children and deer crossing signs were also removed as drivers have a tendency to not notice them after a while. The town board removed signs under the guidance of our township engineer, who made recommendations to the board.

Road Projects

<u>Pike Road</u>:

The road leading to the landfill had sustained damage from last spring. A section of the road was repaired with geo – textile and the grade was raised.

East Lake Carlos Drive and Carlos Bluffs:

Both roads received asphalt crackfill. ELCD was filled from CR 42 to Prairie Road.

Road Maintenance/Snow Removal:

All work orders need to be directed from the board. If any resident has a concern or question regarding road maintenance, please contact a board member and they will then contact the road maintainer.

Township Roads

Per Minnesota Statute Chapter 160.2715 it is unlawful to dump, plow, or push snow from a private driveway onto or across a public road, i.e. township, county or state. This issue has been addressed in numerous township newsletters and in the Echo Press.

This practice is in violation of this statute and can be prosecuted for a misdemeanor and can result in a fine of up to \$500.00. The Douglas County Sheriff's department will be the enforcer of this statute. All costs to reblade the road will be incurred to the offending property owner.

It is also illegal to burn leaves on the roadway, or remove Class V from the township road.

Upcoming Road Projects for 2013

The board is looking to address road repairs on Buckskin East, Johnson Road, Three Havens, South Lake Miltona, Adventure Lane and any other repairs deemed necessary. All roads will be inspected during the annual road tour held in late April or May



Great News to Finish 2012

With excellent cooperation from department heads, the county board was able to LOWER the levy for 2013. We were able to lower it by 0.31%, keeping the services folks want, plus the mandates the county receives. It was a concerted effort on everyone's part.

The Services Center remodeling is being finalized. The Law Enforcement Center on the north end of the building held and open house. This section houses the new multimillion dollar Dispatch Equipment mandated by the State. Also, Public Health, Social Services & other departments will now have enough- much needed room for long into the future.

Brett Bergland was named Director of Information Technology.

By refinancing bonds in November, it saved taxpayers \$779,297.14. The Annual Report was given by Pete Olmscheid, Director of Pope Douglas Solid Waste Plant.

The Board voted to keep the Hospice Program under the county's control.

Raises were given to elected department heads, i.e. Attorney, Recorder, Auditor/Treasurer and Sheriff. The

County Board took no increase, as we haven't for the past nine years.

Approval was given to repair several county ditches, along with approving Latham Landscape Architects to study our Park & Trail System.

The non-partisan "League of Women Voters" informed the board they would be starting a chapter in this area again.

The Robert Wood Foundation is presenting the county with a grant for the Hospice Program for 2 years in the amount of \$125,000 for each year.

The Board presented five main issues to the Minnesota Rural Counties Caucus they want presented to the Legislature.

The board recognized Commissioners Paul Anderson and Norm Salto for their years of service to the board.
