## Milona Carlos Bridge

Dave Robley, Douglas County engineer, has indicated this bridge is the next one to be replaced in the county. As of this printing, the replacement of the bridge has not been scheduled for this year and has not been identified as to when construction will begin, as there is no funding available. He will coordinate with the township once funding looks promising.

## Road Projects

Buckskin West: A portion of this road was reconstructed this year.

South Milona Drive/Adventure Lane: The townships of Carlos and Milona shared costs on a tar overlay.

Circle Drive, Three Havens and Stardust Lane: received a tar overlay this year.

Johnson Road: A section of Johnson Road will be repaired this spring. Construction was delayed from last fall as the work could not be finished before cold weather arrived.

**It is also illegal to burn leaves on the roadway, or remove Class V from the township road.**

## **Road Maintenance/Snow Removal** **Concerns from residents**

All work orders need to be directed from the board. If any resident has a concern or question regarding road maintenance, please contact a board member and they will then contact the road maintainer.

## **Pushing Snow across Township** **Roads**

Per Minnesota Statute Chapter 160.2715 it is unlawful to dump, plow, or push snow from a private driveway onto or across a public road, i.e. township, county or state. This issue has been addressed in numerous township newsletters and in the Echo Press.

This practice is in violation of this statute and can be prosecuted for a misdemeanor and can result in a fine of up to \$500.00. The Douglas County Sheriff's department will be the enforcer of this statute. All costs to re-blade the road will be incurred to the offending property owner.

## **Upcoming Road Projects for 2014**

The board is looking to address road repairs on Buckskin East, Johnson Road, and any other roads deemed necessary. There is a petition to pave Hidden Oaks Dr. The board will be obtaining bids on this project in the spring and a special meeting will be held to determine if the project will move forward.

All roads will be inspected during the annual road tour held in late April or early May.

## News from Commissioner Bev Bales

The Douglas County Board met January 7, 2014 for the Reorganization for the year. Bev Bales was elected Chairwoman; Charlie Meyer, Vice Chairman. The only newspaper that meets the County's requirements is the Echo Press, which was named to publish all the necessary county notices. The Echo Press costs went up 2% for 2014.

On January 14, the Board approved for Commissioner Jerry Johnson to serve on the Douglas County Fair Board (the Ag Association) per their request. The Board accepted donations to the Hospice program of \$6,101.00 and \$500 to the Senior Companion Program. The Board approved Charitable Gambling for the United Way at Arrowwood Resort along with approving the hiring of Mary Jo O'Brien to head the multi-program, "The Nurse Family Partnership."

Public Works Director asked the Board to send thank you letters to the 146 groups who cleaned the county ditches through the "Adopt a Highway" program. In 2013 over 1,500 bags of garbage were picked up. Shutter's was confirmed for the vehicle maintenance contract for the year. Several licenses, excavator, disposal, etc. were approved. Minnesota Rural Counties Caucus Committee is asking for input as to what priorities they have for the Board to work on for this year's Legislative session.

A credit card fee of 2.5% was approved to charge those using credit cards for county business. This is the same amount charged by several other counties. The Board approved the cleaning of County Ditch 22. An Invasive Species Grant will be applied for again, even though stopping the zebra mussels is no doubt a losing cause, slowing the spread of them is important, Last year over 1,800 watercraft were inspected. Less than 50 were found to have mussels & plant matter, therefore the inspections do assist in the spreading of the invasive specie. Parks & Trails are in charge of where the county can set up inspections.

An update was given on the Capital Improvement Plan - what needs to be replaced and when. Upgrades with heating/air conditioning, etc. are expected to cost about \$201,000 for 2014. The Board approved filling the housekeeper and custodian/groundskeeper vacancies.
