

MINUTES – MILTONA CARLOS - ROAD IMPROVEMENT HEARING
CARLOS TOWN BOARD
June 12, 2018 – Carlos Elementary School

Board Members attending: Rod Meyers, Bill Krivanek, Dan Lehmkuhl, Dean Yohnke, and Rebecca Anderson.

Guest attending: Four guests attended the hearing, see the list of names on record with the clerk.

Chairman Meyers called the hearing to order at 8:00 PM with all reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dan Lehmkuhl moved to approve Resolution 2018-11 calling for the public hearing for June 12, 2018. Bill Krivanek seconded the motion and it carried.

The board introduced themselves to the residents.

Chairman Meyers indicated the public hearing was being recorded.

Since the group was small, residents stated the clerk did not need to read the Public Hearing Rules.

Clerk Rebecca Anderson read the Summary of Due Process for Miltona Carlos Road.

Chairman Meyers affirmed the clerk had filed the affidavits for Notice of Mailing, Posting and Publishing.


Clerk Rebecca Anderson addressed the group with average assessments for the last three road paving projects ranging from \$3,600 – \$3,700, with the new project of Carlos Timbers East estimated at coming in at \$4,700.00. The board is looking to assess two property owners an amount that would be fair, as the county has contracted with the township to pave the Miltona Carlos Bridge. The township will pave the road from the bridge to CR 13.

Residents thought money could be better spent to clean up the river and control traffic, as this bridge is the get off point for rafters/tubers using the river. Bill Murray suggested he sell a portion of his land for parking. Todd Powers felt people were abusing property, leaving garbage along the side of the road, etc.

Bill Krivanek stated all the objections given to the river usage, did not have any bearing on paving the road.

The board will make their decision at the regular meeting on Thursday, June 14, 2018. The residents are welcome to attend that meeting. The clerk will notify the two residents of the board's decision.

Bill Krivanek moved to close the hearing at 8:31 PM. Dan Lehmkuhl seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.
