Special Primary Election
Carlos Township will be joining the City of Carlos and Belle River Township for the School District 206 primary to select a board member. School District 206 must hold a primary as there are more than two (2) candidates campaigning for the one (2) position. The primary election will be held on Tuesday, August 10, 2021. The polls will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM and will be held at the Carlos Town Hall at 210 Victoria Street in Carlos (by the park - behind Herby's). The General election will be held Tuesday, November 2, 2021. The school district will be conducting the election. The Department of Health will make recommendations in regard to COVID-19 stipulations. If voting in person poses a concern, please take advantage of voting absentee.

You may do so at the county auditor's office before Election Day.

Be sure to exercise your right to vote!

Am I eligible to vote?

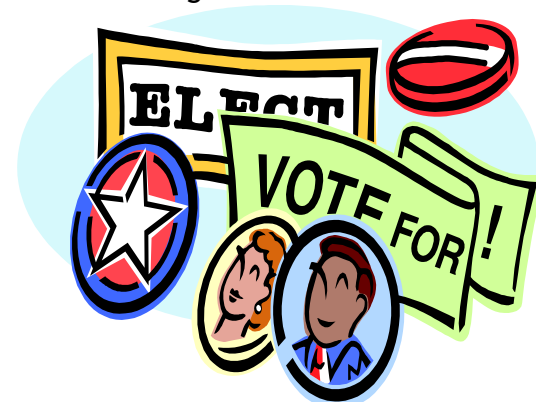
You may register and vote in Minnesota on Election Day if you:

- Will be at least 18-years old on Election Day
- Are a citizen of the United States
- Will have resided in Minnesota for 20 days immediately preceding Election Day
- Have any felony conviction record discharged, expired, or completed
- Are not under court-ordered guardianship where a court has revoked your voting rights
- Have not been ruled legally incompetent by a court of law
- If you are already registered to vote, MN law does not require you to present ID.

Registering on Election Day

If you are not registered to vote or need to update your registration information, you may do so at your local polling location on Election Day. However, you are required to provide proof of residence and ID when registering on Election Day.

Check out the Secretary of State website or the County Auditor to review which documents are needed to register.



Road Projects

R&R will begin clearing brush in the township Right of Ways.

Calcium Chloride has been applied on gravel roads. The roads are very dry this year due to lack of rain.
